2. **KNOW HOW TO LOG ON TO THE COLLEGE NETWORK**

As a registered student, you received an email from the Registrar's Office providing important information about your registration, fees and payment options, multifactor authentication, student orientation, parking, login information for MyACC, your Assiniboine network account, and your college email. Note: **If you have not received this email**, you may not be registered and may not have access to the college network. For questions related to your registration, email registration@assiniboine.net.

Multifactor Authentication (MFA)

Assiniboine Community College requires all students and staff to use an additional method to verify identity when accessing college systems, this is known as [multifactor authentication \(MFA\)](#). MFA adds an extra layer of security to protect you, your personal information and college systems from unauthorized access and phishing attacks.

In order to access any program on the College's network, including MyACC, you are required to:

1. Download the free DUO Mobile app on your own mobile device and follow the enrollment steps outlined in the video on the MFA webpage, visit assiniboine.net/mfa. *Note: You will only do this when you first attempt to access our college system. Do not delete the app after, you will need it for every time you login to Assiniboine services.*

OR

2. Purchase a YubiKey, costs vary by type and are available at the Bookstore. It is important to know the type required for your device.

MyACC

MyACC allows you to view **MyClass Schedule**, financial account, current and past grades, evaluate your progress in your program, your profile (name, address etc.), **make on-line payments**, set up a payment plan (eligible programs only), change your address, view tax information, request a transcript, etc. ***Note: Class schedules may be modified up to and including the first day of classes, please check your schedule regularly for updates.***

3. **UPLOAD A PHOTO FOR YOUR STUDENT ID CARD**

Getting your Student ID Card is a two-part process:

1. Check that your name, address, and contact information is correct in MyACC. Refer to the registration email you received from the Registrar's Office.
2. Go to 'MyPersonalInformation' and log in with your college username and password to upload and submit your photo as soon as you are registered. *Student ID Cards are not available until a photo has been uploaded.*

4. **GET YOUR BOOKS & ASSINIBOINE SWAG**

Textbooks, supplies, Assiniboine clothing and uniforms can be purchased online or at the Campus Store, visit assiniboineshop.ca for more information. 5. **APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES**

7. APPLY FOR TRANSFER CREDIT

If you have taken courses at other accredited educational institutes that are the same, or very similar to courses offered at Assiniboine, you can apply for a transfer of credit. If you think this may apply to you, please read policy [A07 Credit for Previous Education](#) and submit the form attached to the policy, along with the course outlines from your prior institution, as early as possible to the **Registrar's Office**. You may also email the completed form and outlines to transfercredit@assiniboine.net.

8. APPLY FOR PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT RECOGNITION

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) provides the opportunity to obtain credit for college level knowledge and skills gained outside of the classroom. If you have acquired learning from formal education, work, and/or volunteer experience, personal study and other life activities you may consider applying for PLAR. 9. PURCHASE PARKING OR GET A BUS PASS

Students studying at campuses in Brandon are eligible for the U-Pass program, which is a Brandon Transit pass sponsored by the ACC Students' Association. Students require their current Student ID Card to receive a U-Pass card. Students must upload their photo prior to arriving on campus to have their Student ID Card available at their orientation or on the first day of class. Program Delivery

Clinical Placements

Clinical education continues to be an expectation of the program, preparing students with the competencies and confidence to work in this field following graduation. Assiniboine works with health authorities, industry partners, and the College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Manitoba (CLPNM) to ensure clinical placement requirements for students are met.

Students must be available for all clinical placements, which may include days, evenings, nights, and weekends. Students may be required to travel for clinical placements.

Safe Work Practice and Personal Protective Equipment Needs
