Assiniboine Cougars women's volleyball recruits Brandonnite

BRANDON, Man. (May 8, 2018) — The Assiniboine Cougars women's volleyball team has added Jordanna Chartrand of Brandon, Man. to their lineup for the 2018-19 Manitoba Colleges Athletic Conference (MCAC) season.

Jordanna Chartrand is a 5'2" player, who has played club volleyball with the Westman Wild of the Westman Volleyball Club and high school volleyball at Crocus Plains Regional Secondary School. Chartrand will be studying in the college's two-year Social Service Worker program.

"There's a bit of nervousness as I have played for the same coach (Jeff Werbowski) for the past three club seasons and the same team," said Chartrand. "Werbowski has always pushed me and helped me to be confident in the volleyball player that I can be."

"We are very excited to have Jordanna join our team," said Maxwell. "She brings a high level of athletic ability and a strong desire to compete."

Chartrand plays libero on the Westman Wild team and has been the setter for Crocus Plains in the past. Head coach Jeff Maxwell expects that she will continue to play as libero and be the back up setter for the Cougars.

"I'm excited to be coming to Assiniboine Community College and playing volleyball," said Chartrand. "It's a new chapter that I am looking forward to. I am excited to be playing with and getting to know the group of girls on the team as well as the coaching staff. So, all in all, I am excited for the season to start and to be a part of the Cougars women's volleyball team."
