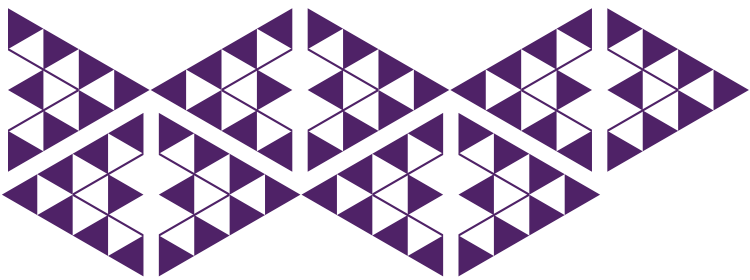

# A MESSAGE FROM THE President



This past year at Assiniboine has been filled with meaningful opportunities for our students, many of which were made possible through your generous support. Your gift continues to enrich the student experience at Assiniboine College, opening doors, inspiring confidence, and helping students take important steps towards a brighter future.

In the 2024/25 academic year, we celebrated 2,833 graduates, one of the largest classes in Assiniboine's history.

Over that same time frame, we led the nation in community-based programming, delivering classes in 46 communities across Manitoba. Among this year's graduates were 338 Indigenous learners, representing 27 per cent of our total domestic graduates and underscoring our commitment to inclusive, community-based, education. Notably, Manitoba experienced the largest increase in post-secondary participation among 18- to 24-year-olds between 2014/15 and 2024/25, highlighting the importance of expanding access to education. Our Graduate Follow-up Survey of our 2024/25 graduates further reflects this impact, with 91 per cent of graduates employed within nine months and 96 per cent

choosing to live in Manitoba. This translates into a net population gain as only 63 per cent of the graduates from this class originated from our province.

Behind each of these numbers are students shaped by their story – one shaped by determination, opportunity, and transformational experiences. Whether it is a learner taking the first step into post-secondary education or a graduate stepping confidently into their career, these journeys are made possible through your commitments like you have made.

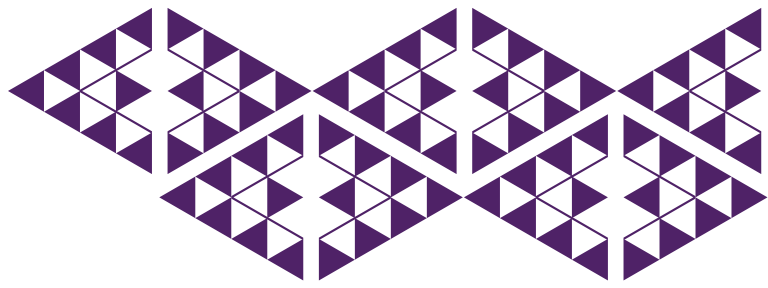

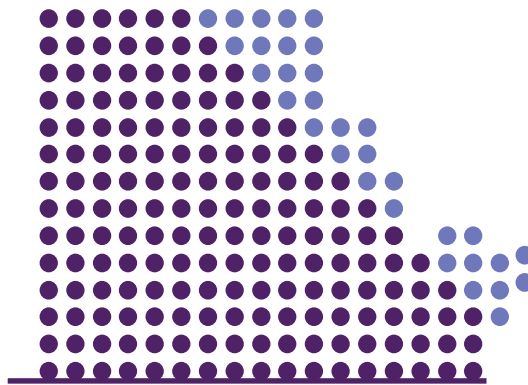

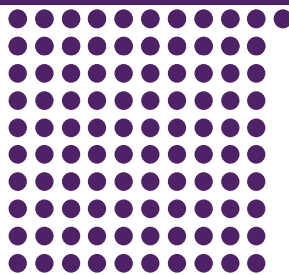

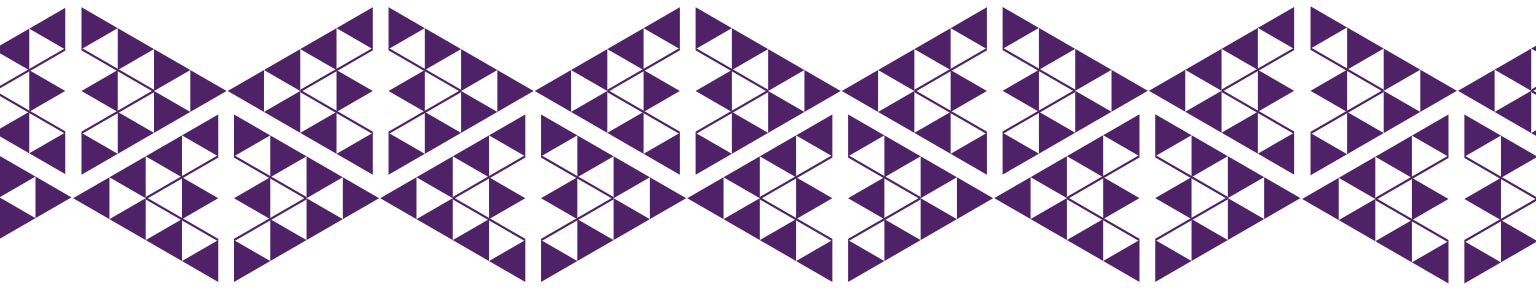

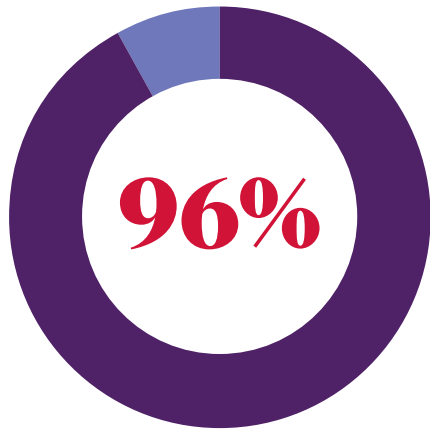

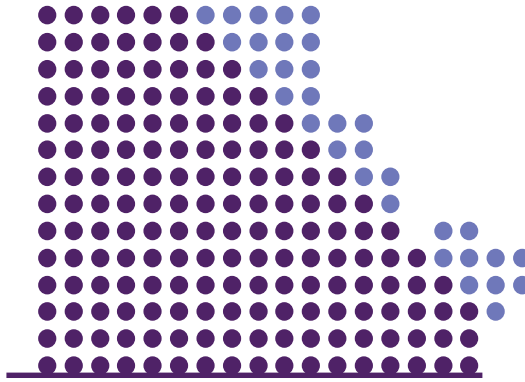

## FOUR YEARS AFTER GRADUATION



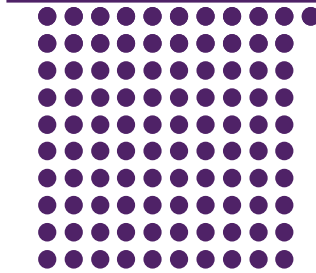

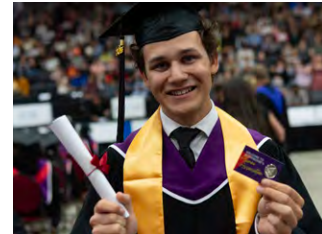

Average annual income of an Assiniboine grad four years after graduation

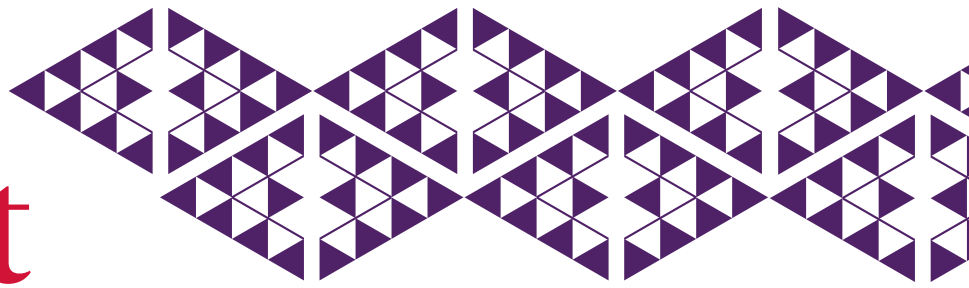

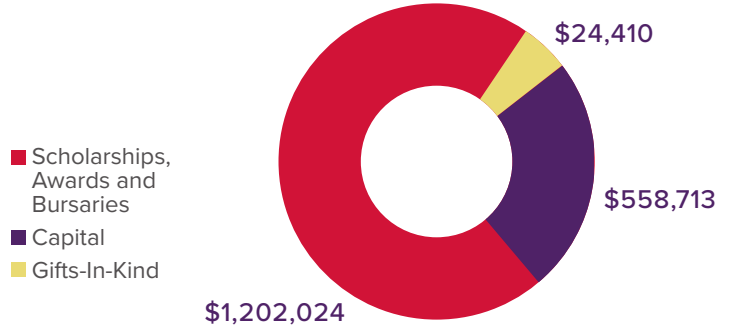

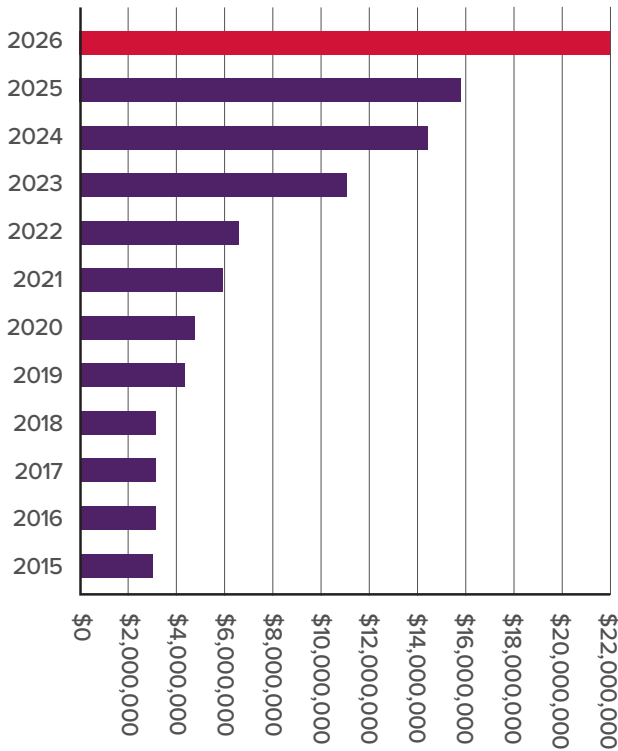

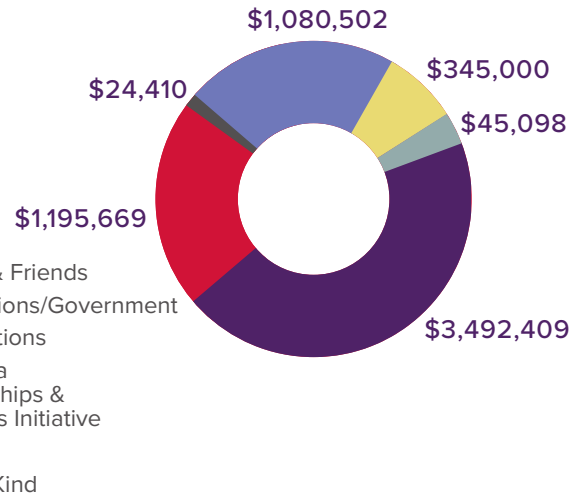
Net assets held by

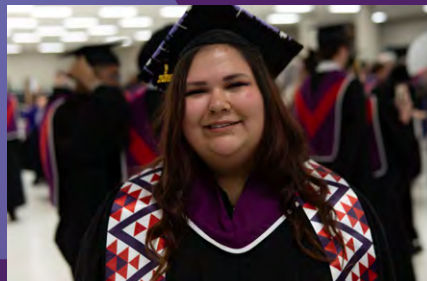
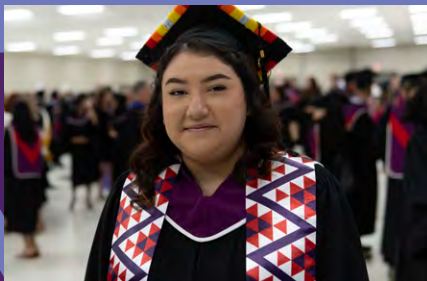
# Indigenous Education

## Assiniboine Received Global Award for Community Program Delivery

Assiniboine College has been recognized for its national leadership in community-based program delivery with a bronze medal in Indigenous Education at the World Federation of Colleges and Polytechnics (WFCP) annual World Congress.

Through partnerships with Indigenous organizations and Nations, Assiniboine's Community Development department focuses on place-based learning to advance Indigenous education and foster community growth throughout Manitoba.

In the 2026 Graduate Follow-up Survey, 92 per cent of Indigenous graduates of the class of 2024-25 were employed within nine months of graduating, with 98 per cent choosing to live in Manitoba after graduation.



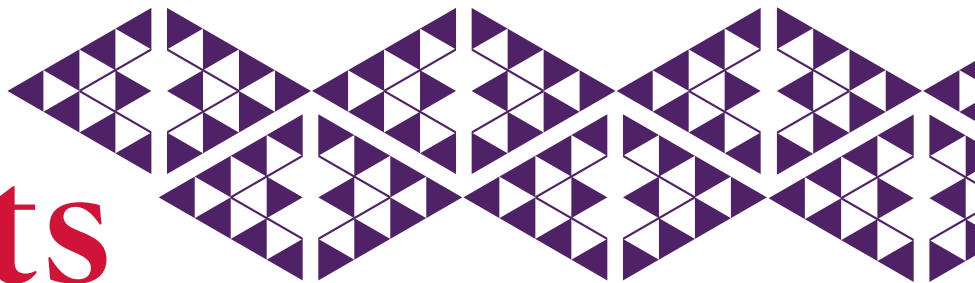

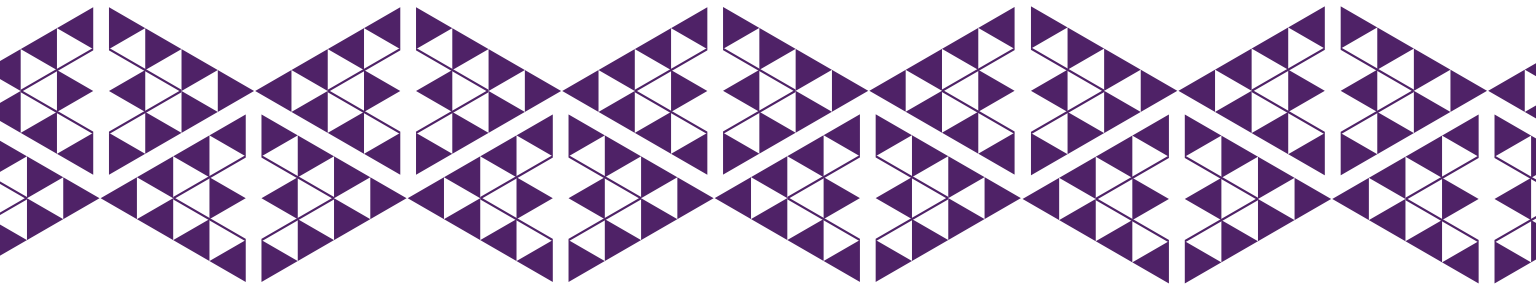


## Creative Media celebrates new Auriat Family Broadcast Studio



Students in the Creative Media program will gain valuable hands-on radio experience with the opening of the newly named Auriat Family Broadcast Studio. Located within Assiniboine College's Centre for Creative Media, the studio serves as a real-life broadcast environment where students develop practical skills, including hosting on the college-community station CJ106-FM.

The space was named in recognition of the Auriat family's longstanding support of education and media in the community. Opened in 2022, the Centre for Creative Media continues to be a key resource for Manitoba's growing digital media industry, providing students with job-ready training across multiple creative disciplines.



## Assiniboine College Named Among Canada's Top 50 Research Colleges



Assiniboine has received significant investment to strengthen its applied research and horticulture programming, including support from the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership, the Canada Foundation for Innovation, Research Manitoba. Notably, a \$1 million award from the Canada Foundation for Innovation was matched by \$1 million from the Province of Manitoba through Research Manitoba, contributing to the development of a new \$5 million teaching and research greenhouse. These investments support expanded infrastructure, hands-on learning, and applied research focused on sustainability.

This funding supports the continued growth of Assiniboine's applied research and extension programming by uniting agricultural education, innovation, industry collaboration, and hands-on research. The college has already achieved a key strategic goal—being named one of Canada's Top 50 Research Colleges—earning the 47th spot among publicly funded institutions. Reaching this milestone ahead of its 2030 target reflects the strength and impact of Assiniboine's research, which continues to advance agricultural practices, sustainable horticulture, and environmental stewardship, with a focus on crop sustainability, pest management, soil health, and clean technologies.

## Creative CoLab Strengthens Entrepreneurship and Innovation with PrairiesCan Support

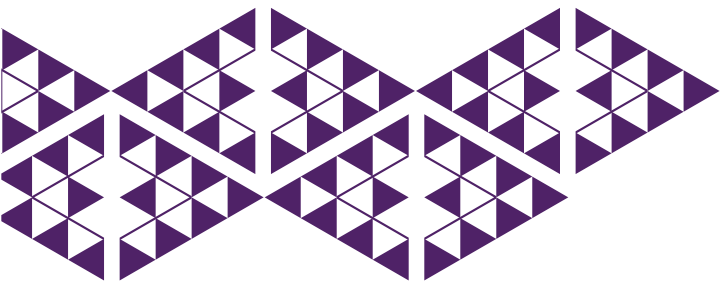
Assiniboine College has launched the Creative CoLab, a new hub designed to bring together creativity, technology, and business development. The space provides students, entrepreneurs, and community members with access to modern tools, collaborative work areas, and opportunities to explore ideas and build connections across disciplines.

“The Creative CoLab will be a hub for helping to build creative industries and economic activity in Brandon,” said Mark Frison, President of Assiniboine College. “In addition to state-of-the-art space and equipment, we will work with industry to create connections, expose opportunities, and support growth in knowledge-based sectors.”

Equipped with tools such as 3D printers, a wide-format printer, and laser engravers, the CoLab supports hands-on learning and experimentation. The space is designed to help users transform ideas into tangible projects, while also offering flexible areas for meetings, workshops, and collaboration.

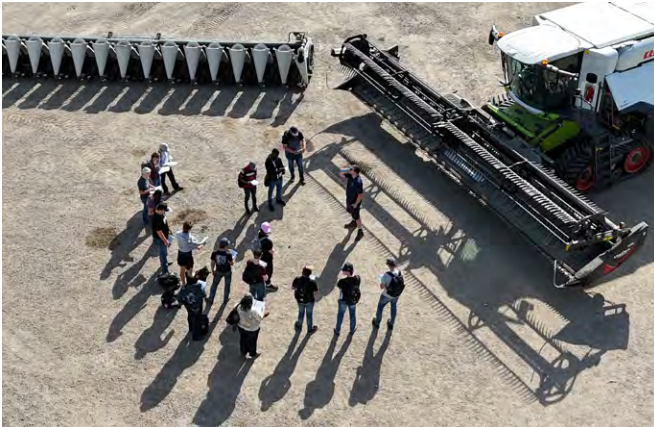
The Creative CoLab builds on Assiniboine’s strong foundation of applied learning and industry engagement, complementing the Centre for Creative Media within the Peters School of Business. With nearly \$3 million invested across these spaces, support from Prairies Economic Development Canada has been integral to bringing this vision to life and expanding opportunities for innovation and entrepreneurship in Manitoba.

## **Silversides Bursary for Steinbach Nursing Students**

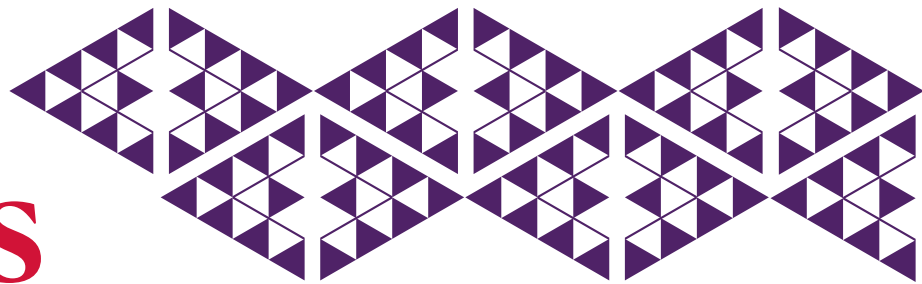

## Culinary Students Bring Home Gold

Two culinary students from Assiniboine College, Alicia DeCosse and Presley Kuharski, earned top honours at the Taste Canada Cook the Books competition in Toronto—part of a national celebration of Canadian culinary talent. Competing against students from across the country, they created a globally inspired dish using Canadian-grown ingredients for a panel of industry judges.

Inspired by this year's theme, Global Flavours Grow in Canada, the pair drew on their interest in Japanese cuisine to develop a dish that blended international influence with local ingredients, including carrots and pea shoots grown through Assiniboine programs.

Preparation involved extensive testing and refinement, building on their classroom learning and experiences growing up in western Manitoba. Competing on a national stage was a rewarding milestone, particularly as they represented their college alongside larger institutions.

Supported by faculty and guided by instructor Rebekah Roberts, the students demonstrated skill and determination throughout the experience. Their success highlights the strength of Assiniboine's culinary programs and the value of hands-on, real-world learning.

# Social Service Worker Building Community Through Leadership

## STUDENT SPOTLIGHT: ALEC WALTERS, SOCIAL SERVICE WORKER ('26)

When Alec Walters arrived in Canada from Jamaica, he brought with him a strong sense of community and a passion for helping others. Now in his second year of Assiniboine's Social Service Worker program, Alec serves as president of the Assiniboine College Students' Association (ACSA) and was recently recognized with the prestigious Manitoba Council for International Education (MCIE) International Student Award.

Inspired by his sister, a former Assiniboine instructor, Alec chose the Social Service Worker program to pursue meaningful work supporting others. "Growing up in Jamaica taught me the value of community and being there for each other," he says.

Adjusting to life in Canada wasn't always easy. Alec says making connections was one of his biggest challenges, but becoming involved with the Students' Association helped him find a sense of belonging. From serving as a student representative to leading the ACSA, he has focused on creating supportive spaces for students through initiatives like the Wellness Wagon and men's mental health events.

Alec hopes to continue working in social services after graduation, supporting people through difficult circumstances and encouraging open conversations around mental health.

His advice for future students and newcomers: "Don't be afraid to try because mistakes often teach more than success."

## Growing up at Assiniboine: Heritage Co-op CEO reflects on deep roots at the college

For Heritage Co-op CEO Leanne DeVliegere, Assiniboine has always felt like home.

Growing up in Brandon, Leanne spent time on campus while her father, Dan Collens, taught heavy-duty mechanics at the college before later retiring as Dean of Student Services.

“The halls felt familiar,” Leanne recalls. “I attended as a student, the college hosted our wedding reception, and my dad spent many years there as an instructor. Assiniboine has always felt like home.”

A 2000 graduate of Assiniboine’s Business Administration program, Leanne says the college’s smaller class sizes and supportive environment helped ease the transition from high school to post-secondary education.

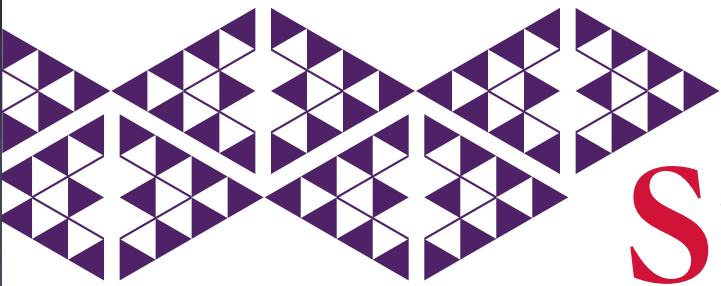
“I got to know my instructors well, and they brought real-world experience into the classroom,” she says. “The college had everything I needed to succeed.”

Through her co-op work placement, Leanne landed a summer position at a credit union, which became her first full-time role and launched a successful career in financial services and leadership. After spending 15 years with Westoba Credit Union and later serving as COO at Fusion Credit Union, she became CEO of Heritage Co-op in December 2024.

Today, she continues to value the sense of community and connection that helped shape her career journey.

“Education is critical,” Leanne says. “It broadens your mind, builds confidence, and connects you with people and perspectives.”

## Assiniboine's Vision for the Future of Agriculture

The Prairie Innovation Centre (PIC) for Sustainable Agriculture is Assiniboine's vision for the future of agriculture education and innovation in Manitoba and a response to labour market gaps in the industry. Located on the college's North Hill campus in Brandon, the Centre will bring together collaborative learning spaces, applied research labs and multipurpose facilities designed to serve both students and industry partners.

The Prairie Innovation Centre will expand agriculture-related programming capacity from 300 to more than 800 students annually while supporting labour

market development, applied research and industry engagement. New programs in areas such as food science, environmental technology, robotics and industrial automation will help prepare graduates for evolving careers in agriculture and agri-food industries.

Built on pillars of programming, applied research and collaboration, the Centre reflects Assiniboine's commitment to practical problem-solving, food security and innovation. By strengthening training and research opportunities, the Prairie Innovation Centre will help address labour shortages and support the continued growth of Manitoba's agriculture sector.

## New Strategic Plan

Our Board of Governors adopted a refreshed Strategic Direction for the college that will guide us through to 2030. Assiniboine College remains committed to evolving and expanding credential offerings—micro-credentials, certificates, diplomas, degrees, and graduate programs—to meet student and labour market needs. We will create supportive education models that foster belonging, resilience, and success for all learners.

As a Canadian leader in community-based education, we ensure all Manitobans have access to high-quality,

career-focused learning. Guided by our Academic Plan, we prioritize student success, Indigenization, and community engagement. With strong leadership in agriculture, environment and public safety programs, Assiniboine continues to set the national standard for community-based education and workforce-driven programming.

2,030 Assiniboine graduates by 2030 will help to address Manitoba's lagging post-secondary attainment rate and prepare more people for economic growth and community service.

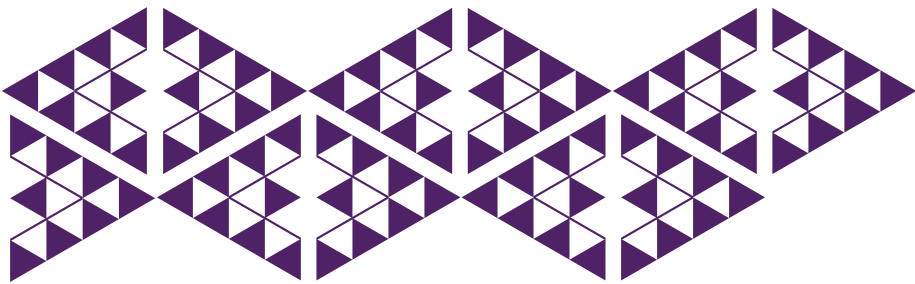

# LEAVING A Legacy

## A Legacy Rooted in the Prairie

In December 2024, Assiniboine College lost a valued alumna and friend. Through a generous gift of more than \$265,000 in her will, Mame Curle ensured her family's legacy—and her belief in education—will continue to shape Manitoba's future.

A graduate of the Welfare Services program when the college was known as the Manitoba Vocational Centre, Mame carried deep agricultural roots. Her grandfather, Robert Johnston, arrived in Manitoba in 1879 and established a homestead in the Municipality of Elton. He later helped open new opportunities for trade and agriculture when land was secured for the railway through the Town of Justice. Farming remained central to the family for generations, and Mame understood firsthand the importance of advancing agricultural knowledge.

Through her estate gift to the Prairie Innovation Centre campaign, Mame named a space in her grandfather's memory—honouring the past while investing in the future of prairie agriculture.

Her generosity is a quiet but powerful reminder that legacy gifts can reflect the people and values that shape our lives.

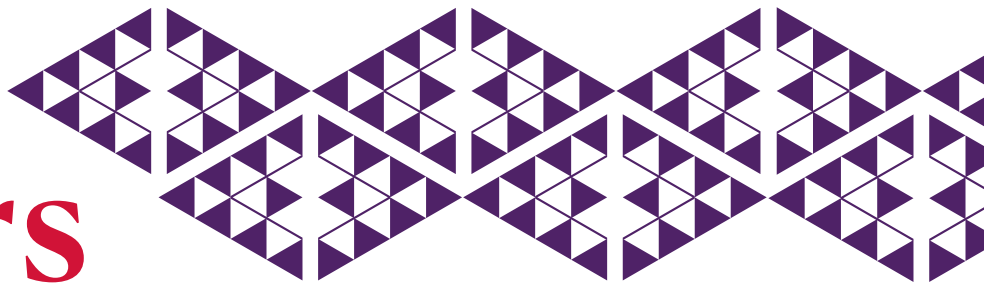

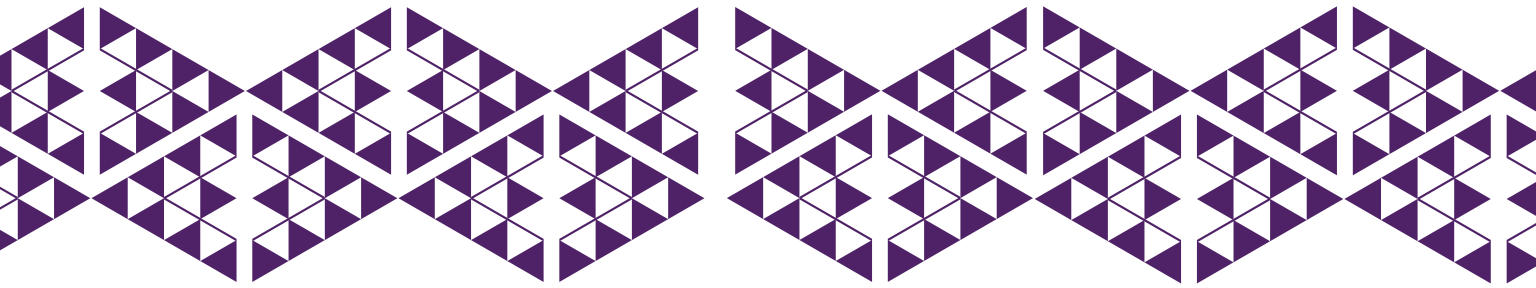
