Depending on their circumstances, applicants may wish to include evidence of:

- **Movable assets**, such as savings accounts, fixed or term deposits, investment portfolios, mutual funds, stocks, bonds, pension funds, retirement savings, and other liquid financial assets.
- **Immovable assets**, including residential, commercial, agricultural, or investment properties, together with ownership documents, property valuations, mortgage information (if applicable), and rental income records.
- **Additional sources of income**, such as employment income, business income, self-employment earnings, agricultural income, rental income, pensions, dividends, royalties, trust income, scholarships, bursaries, education loans, or other recurring sources of financial support.
