2. **KNOW HOW TO LOG ON TO THE COLLEGE NETWORK**

As a registered student, you received an email from the Registrar's Office providing important information about your registration, fees and payment options, multifactor authentication, student orientation, parking, login information for Assiniboine Connect (formerly MyACC), your Assiniboine network account, and your college email. Note: **If you have not received this email**, you may not be registered and may not have access to the college network. For questions related to your registration, email registration@assiniboine.net.

Multifactor Authentication (MFA)

Assiniboine College requires all students and staff to use an additional method to verify identity when accessing college systems, known as [multifactor authentication \(MFA\)](#). MFA adds an extra layer of security to protect you, your personal information and college systems from unauthorized access and phishing attacks.

In order to access any program on the College's network, including Assiniboine Connect, you are required to:

1. Download the free DUO Mobile app on your own mobile device and follow the enrollment steps outlined in the video on the MFA webpage, visit assiniboine.net/mfa. *Note: You will only do this when you first attempt to access our college system. Do not delete the app after, you will need it for every time you login to Assiniboine services.*

OR

2. Purchase a YubiKey, costs vary by type and are available at the Bookstore. It is important to know the type required for your device.

Assiniboine Connect

Assiniboine Connect allows you to view **MyClass Schedule**, financial account, current and past grades, evaluate your progress in your program, your profile (name, address etc.), **make on-line payments**, set up a payment plan (eligible programs only), change your address, view tax information, request a transcript, etc. ***Note: Class schedules may be modified up to and including the first day of classes, please check your schedule regularly for updates.***

You can access Assiniboine Connect at connect.assiniboine.net. It is important that you check it regularly to ensure you are on track to graduate. Assiniboine Connect Help documents are available in Moodle and the Student Intranet. You must be logged in using MFA to access these resources.

You should also use your official college email for communicating with any college department and it is important that you check your college email regularly.

3. UPLOAD A PHOTO FOR YOUR STUDENT ID CARD

Getting your Student ID Card is a two-part process:

1. *Log into* Assiniboine Connect at connect.assiniboine.net with your college username and password.
2. Under 'MyPersonalInformation', click on My Photo to upload and submit your photo as soon as you are registered. *Student ID Cards are not available until a photo has been uploaded.*

Your card will be handed out by your School in the first week of classes. Visit [Student ID Cards](#) for more information.

4. PURCHASE PARKING OR GET A BUS PASS

Student parking is available at each campus. Please refer to assiniboine.net/parking for the list of options and/or pricing for your campus location. Parking is sold on a first come, first served basis and can sell out. If you are interested in purchasing parking, it is best to submit your request as soon as possible.

Students studying at campuses in Brandon are eligible for the U-Pass program, which is a Brandon Transit pass. Students require their current Student ID Card to receive a U-Pass card. Students must upload their photo prior to arriving on campus to have their Student ID Card available at their orientation or on the first day of class.

5. REGISTER FOR THE FREE GET READY FOR COLLEGE ONLINE INFORMATION SESSION

The Get Ready for College online session contains lots of information and gives you the opportunity to ask any questions, visit assiniboine.net/getreadyforcollege for information. Your program may host a program-specific orientation, watch your college email for more information.

6. **GET YOUR BOOKS & ASSINIBOINE SWAG**

Textbook and supply lists are available online 30 calendar days prior to the program start date. View the “Tools & Supplies” tab on your program page <https://assiniboine.net/programs/practical-nursing> to obtain your copy.

Textbooks, supplies, Assiniboine clothing and uniforms can be purchased online or at the Campus Store. Visit assiniboine.bkstr.com for more information. The Campus Store is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday to Friday. **Note: it is important that you know your schedule when purchasing your books and supplies as requirements are identified by course, not by program.**

7. **RESERVE A LOCKER**

Lockers at the Victoria Avenue East and North Hill campuses in Brandon are managed by the Assiniboine College Students' Association (ACSA). **Students who wish to have a locker during their studies at these campuses must reserve a locker.** Any locker being used without a proper reservation will have it's contents removed by Security.

If you are a student at one of Assiniboine's other campuses, lockers will be managed by your School administrative office.

If you wish to reserve a locker, follow the steps below, reservations open August 2026.

1. Download the ACSA Students App
2. Create your account
3. Click “More” on the bottom right of the screen
4. Select “Locker Reservations”
5. Choose your campus location, program, and preferred locker for the year

8. GET CAUGHT UP ON THE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT YOUR PROGRAM

Welcome to Practical Nursing!

Assiniboine's two-year Practical Nursing diploma program prepares graduates to meet the entry-level competencies of the College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Manitoba (CLPNM) and to be eligible to apply for licensure as a Practical Nurse in Manitoba.

Licensed practical nurses (LPNs) are regulated healthcare professionals who provide nursing care to clients in a variety of healthcare settings, including hospitals, personal care homes, and the community.

Clinical Placements

Clinical education prepares students with the competencies and confidence to work in this field following graduation. Assiniboine works with health authorities, the College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Manitoba (CLPNM), and industry partners to ensure clinical placement requirements for students are met.

Students must be available for all clinical placements, which may include days, evenings, nights, and weekends. Travel may be required.

Students will receive further details closer to their clinical placement start dates.

Safe Work Practice and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Needs

PPE requirements will be noted for students on their tools & supplies lists. These can be found on your specific program's webpage.

The college's PPE standards for on campus activities will reflect current public health standards, and program and activity-specific safe work practices. In clinical placements, all facilities will be providing students with the necessary PPE.

9. **APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES**

11. **APPLY FOR TRANSFER CREDIT**

If you have taken courses at other accredited educational institutions that are the same, or very similar to courses offered at Assiniboine, you can apply for a transfer of credit. If you think this may apply to you please go to the [Forms & Documents](#) page and read policy A07 Credit for Previous Education and submit the Application for Credit for Previous Education form, along with the course outlines from your prior institution, as early as possible to the **Registrar's Office**. Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) provides the opportunity to obtain credit for college level knowledge and skills gained outside of the classroom.
