TRANSFER AGREEMENT

An Articulation Agreement is a formal agreement between two educational institutions that spells out the terms and conditions for recognizing the learning that is done at one institution and applying that prior learning in the form of transfer credit at the other institution. These will typically be set with Assiniboine Community College (ACC) as the *Receiving* Institution when agreements are set up with Secondary Schools. ACC will be set as the *Sending* institution when students complete a credential at ACC first, then receive transfer credit at another post-secondary institution. This form (or another with the same content if developed by the partner institution) must be used for all ACC Articulation Agreements.

Based on successful completion of the Assiniboine Community College (ACC) Social Service Worker Diploma program and a minimum grade of 2.5 in each of the Diploma courses, a graduate of the ACC Social Service Diploma who is subsequently admitted to the Faculty of Social Work will receive 6 hours of allocated social work credit in 2 required social work courses, SWRK 3130 & SWRK 2080, and 3 unallocated credits of social work electives.

This Transfer credit agreement with ACC addresses only those courses considered transferable as social work courses (whether allocated or unallocated). Other elective (non-social work) ACC courses completed could be considered for a transfer of credits on an individual basis by the University of Manitoba's Admissions' Office and/or the relevant University of Manitoba Department.



10. This agreement will remain in effect for 5 years from the date of signing. It can be withdrawn at any time by either party for any reason provided at least 6 months notice to the other institution.

11. This agreement will be eligible for renewal upon expiry (see Item 10) by providing written notice in the form of the ACC Articulation Agreement Renewal Notice.




