In an age of social media and smartphones, three Assiniboine Community College and one Brandon University alumni, found the only thing missing was musical freedom in social settings.

"Our team was at a pub and the bartender was playing an entire Foo Fighters album. Half our team liked it, but the other half didn't. We realized that we were stuck in a kind of musical dictatorship," Myers said. "Our phones know our location and our musical tastes, so why are we here, listening to music we don't like?"

Consequently, the situation sent Web Design and Media Production grads, Ben Myers, Paul Beaudry and Tyler Johnston, into the fast-paced world of application development

Feeling inspired, the group set out to fulfill their goal of giving music lovers like themselves the democratic listening environment they craved. Beaudry and Myers toyed with upwards of 20 projects before landing on the Anthm concept. "I think it's important to admit to yourself when something just isn't going to work, which in our case, happened a lot!" Beaudry said. "You can learn more from failed projects than successful ones."

Anthm allows users to select their favourite tune and vote it up the queue in a bid to get their selection played sooner. Thanks to their dogged determination, Anthm successfully launched in February 2012 in San Francisco, California with seed funding following almost three months after launch.

"I think it's a relatively new technology that people get excited about when they hear the idea," said Johnston, co-founder and the lead designer on the Anthm project. "This social music listening space has really taken off this past year and I think we're in at the right time."

Director of Development and fellow co-founder, Paul Thorsteinson, (Brandon University 2004 graduate) says, "We've found people often treat Anthm like a fun social game. They rally their friends to vote songs up and take pride when their song jumps to the top of the queue."

"Music is something that's really personal to people. With Anthm you give your friends a fun way to share and discover music in a social setting."

To date, the free application has been downloaded by 70,000 music lovers across North America. These numbers, coupled with heavy-hitting partners, has this venture well on its way.

Users who download the application and its sister service, Rdio, have access to a library of 15 million songs and more are being added weekly. The group also plans to integrate with digital music provider, Spotify, to increase visibility and the number of downloads.

Diving head first into the competitive world of application development would have been a much steeper hill to climb if it weren't for what three of the four men say were life- and careerenriching years at ACC.

For Myers, a Media Production graduate, he says the multi-faceted program showed him how open the career options were upon graduation. He has worked on visual effects projects such as Dragonball Evolution, Journey to the Centre of the Earth, Mr. Magorium's Wonder Emporium, Duplicity and The Ruins. Beaudry and Myers applied their ACC skills to work on the movie Avatar, and more recently The Hunger Games.

For Beaudry, also a Media Production grad, it was the hands-on approach and one-on-one learning opportunities that helped him find his niche. "The program really was a crash course in working in any creative environment," he said. "We learned how to collaborate as a team to take creative ideas, give them substance and present them to people in an interesting and meaningful way. I've used those skills every day since graduation."

Student access to industry-leading technology and what the three men say were the instructor's will to help each student find their forte in the industry, helped plant that entrepreneurial inspiration early on.

- as a model building system, demonstrating and testing low energy consumption using highly renewable approaches.

Programs that will benefit from the sustainable greenhouse include: Agribusiness, Culinary Arts, Environmental Technologies and ACC's new Horticultural Production program.

In addition to the funding provided by the Canada-Manitoba Growing Forward Strategic Innovation Fund - Advancing Agri-Innovation Program, financing for the 1.3 million project is provided by ACC and its partners/donors to the Growing the Greenhouse Campaign. With a goal to raise \$800,000, the campaign has raised \$575,000 to date.
