### It's a family affair

Many families have a personal experience with Assiniboine Community College, but it's a rare occasion when close family members graduate within a few years of one another. Such is the case with the Sale family.

In 2011, both Lyza Sale and her mother Virginia Sale earned their college credentials. Lyza received her diploma from the Media Production program (now Interactive Media Arts), while her mom Virginia earned a certificate in Comprehensive Health Care Aide.

Since graduating in 2011, Nor's sister Lyza has been working with the CBC as a videographer/editor and enjoys traveling throughout Manitoba, Ontario and Saskatchewan recording and editing news stories. Their mom Virginia is a health care aide at the Shoal Lake Health Centre. "ACC was such a big help in me getting to where I am now," said Lyza. "My advice to anyone who might be interested in pursuing their diploma or certificate is to stay curious, always be willing to learn something new and adapt to changes."

## Lieutenant Governor Silver Medal recipients


Each year the Province of Manitoba awards two graduating students with Lieutenant Governor's Silver Medals. These graduates excelled academically, displayed strength of character and contributed to the college and community in a meaningful way.

This past academic year's medal recipients were Nicole McKinnon, who graduated with a diploma in Early Childhood Education, and Larry Makarikhin, who graduated with a diploma in Business Administration.



### Nicole McKinnon, Early Childhood Education (ECE) Diploma

During her two years at ACC, Nicole maintained a better than 4.0 GPA, while being an active volunteer, in both college and community events. Nicole gave her time as a Spend-A-Day host, ECE advisory committee class representative and ACC Students' Association Event Coordinator. One of Nicole's greatest accomplishments was her volunteer trip to Ecuador where she assisted with a water project in a 'ME to WE' village. Nicole is also a talented harpist who implemented her love of music into her projects and assignments.



### Larry Makarikhin, Business Administration Diploma

Larry was the 2014-15 Students' Association President, who always worked towards improving the ACC student experience. He assisted with implementing a new health and dental benefit plan for future students, as well as creating a handbook for future International students. Larry excelled academically, graduating with a GPA of 4.22. He was a member of the winning Business Project team and maintained a full course load along with taking on-line courses to pursue a Certified Professional Accountant (CPA) designation. ## 2015 Graduate Satisfaction & Employment Survey

The survey was conducted from March to May 2015 and included those who graduated between July 2013 and June 2014.

# Another successful graduation season

This past year the college had **more than 1,100 graduates** walk across the stage to receive their certificate, diploma and apprenticeship credentials. This year's new crop of alumni included 27 students from ACC's Adult Collegiate in downtown Brandon, 47 nursing graduates from the Winnipeg campus, 916 students from Brandon's two campuses and 121 students from the Parkland campus.

The Brandon campus group included 739 graduates from 37 different certificate and diploma programs in addition to 177 apprenticeship graduates from seven programs. Some of the grads had families travel from as far away as Colombia and India to attend their graduation ceremony.

Awards were given to 13 students for excellence and achievement at the college's Adult Collegiate ceremony held June 20. Two entrance scholarships were presented to graduates continuing their post-secondary education at ACC. Other awards included the Academic Excellence Award and the Learning Community Award.


