Get College Ready

1. KNOW WHEN YOUR FIRST DAY OF CLASS IS

2. LOG INTO MYACC

As a *registered* student, you received a letter from the Registrar's Office providing important information about your registration, fees and payment options, student orientation (Xplore ACC), login information to MyACC, your Assiniboine network account, college email, parking etc. *Note: If you have not received this letter, you may not be registered and may not have access to MyACC. For questions related to your registration, contact the Registrar's Office (see Contact Information on pg 9).*

MyACC allows you to view your <u>class schedule</u>, financial account, current and past grades, evaluate your progress in your program, your profile (name, address etc.), <u>make on-line payments</u>, set up a payment plan (eligible programs only), register for continuing studies courses, change your address, view tax information, request transcripts etc. . **Note: Class schedules may be modified up to and including the first day of classes, please check your schedule regularly for updates.**

You can access MyACC at <u>myacc.assiniboine.net</u>. It is important that you check it regularly to ensure you are on track to graduate.

4. GET YOUR BOOKS & ASSINIBOINE SWAG

7. APPLY FOR TRANSFER CREDIT

If you have taken courses at other accredited educational institutes that are the same, or very similar to courses offered at Assiniboine, you can apply for a transfer of credit. If you think this may apply to you, please read policy <u>A07 Credit for Previous Education</u> and submit the form attached to the policy, along with the course outlines from your prior institution, as early as possible to the Registrar's Office.

8. APPLY FOR PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT RECOGNITION

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) provides the opportunity to obtain credit for college level knowledge and skills gained outside of the classroom. If you have acquired learning from formal education, work, and/or volunteer experience, personal study and other life activities you may consider applying for PLAR. To learn more, please read policy <u>A06 Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition</u>. Courses available for PLAR are identified with the symbol P in the current <u>academic calendar</u>.

9. PURCHASE PARKING

Student parking is available at each campus. Please refer to www.assiniboine.net/parking for the list of options and/or pricing for your campus location.

For students studying at campuses in Brandon, a free transit bus pass (UPASS) is included in your student fees. This pass is available at the Students' Association office.

10. ATTEND XPLORE ACC

11. GET CAUGHT UP ON THE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT YOUR PROGRAM

Welcome to Welder!

This program focuses on the theory and practical aspects of oxyacetylene, gas metal arc welding, shielded metal arc welding, gas tungsten arc welding and special processes.

Graduates may be credited with Level 1 Welder Apprenticeship (Welding & Fabrication). Study is in the new state-of-the-art welding shop at the Len Evans Centre for Trades and Technology. This program includes a three-week work practicum and general fabrication training. Great employment opportunities exist for graduates of this program.

First Day of Classes – On the first day of classes, all trades students will meet in the Carpentry Shop for a short assembly. Please watch for signage as you drive into the parking lot at the Len Evans Centre for Trades & Technology. There will also be staff around guiding you to the location of the assembly.

Remember to bring on your first day of classes:

- Steel toe boots/shoes
- Safety glasses
- Classroom supplies (binders, paper, pens etc.)
- A lock for your locker

Trades Tool Fair - The Annual Trades Tool Fair will be held in early September. Most trades programs require students to purchase a set of tools for their specific program. Various suppliers will be on campus with displays and students may shop and compare prices. There may also be discounts available. This is a great time to pick up the tools needed for your program.
