

Chuck Judd

Chuck Judd has helped shape the construction industry, specifically the construction electrician trade through his dedication and support to improving the trades. Throughout his career, Chuck has served on numerous boards and committees. He has been a part of the Construction Association of Manitoba since 1996, and was a part of the Provincial Electrical PTAC committee (1995-1998), the Apprenticeship Board (1999-2005), the Construction Industry Advisory Committee regarding the Construction Industry Wages Act (2006-2012), and Assiniboine Community College's Advisory Committee (Construction Electrician). Chuck continuously donated his time and expertise in support of industry.

His father, Lyle Judd and his partner Grant Jamieson introduced Chuck into the electrical business. Chuck spent his summers and days off school working at the shop doing miscellaneous jobs and started in the trade at the age of 17. Chuck completed his electrical apprenticeship at Assiniboine Community College and continued working at Jamieson Judd Ltd. as an electrician. Chuck started managing the business in 1991 and taking over the business in 1995. When Chuck took over the business, there were approximately three electricians and one administrative staff. At the time of Chuck's retirement in late 2022, he had grown the business to a maximum of 36 electricians and multiple administrative staff.

A graduate of the Electrical program at Assiniboine in 1980, Chuck has been a longtime supporter of Assiniboine Community College, specifically the Construction Electrician program, serving as an advisory committee member, as well as hiring and mentoring a number of graduates.

Chuck was presented with the Ben Wiebe Memorial Award in 2006, and with the first ever lifetime membership award from the Construction Association of Rural Manitoba in 2022. This award was presented to Chuck as a result of his dedication to community and the construction industry.
