# Welcome to Assiniboine Community College!

As a *registered* student at Assiniboine there are things that you can do to prepare for a great Assiniboine experience. Please read the steps below to get college ready and experience campus life to its fullest.

# Get College Ready

## 1. KNOW YOUR PROGRAM START DATE

Your program start date is: April 7, 2025. More information will follow from the School of Trades.

## 2. KNOW HOW TO LOG ON TO THE COLLEGE NETWORK

As a registered student, you received an email from the Registrar's Office providing important information about your registration, fees and payment options, multifactor authentication, student orientation, parking, login information for MyACC, your Assiniboine network account, and your college email. Note: **If you have not received this email**, you may not be registered and may not have access to the college network. For questions related to your registration, email *registration@assiniboine.net*.

#### Multifactor Authentication (MFA)

Assiniboine Community College requires all students and staff to use an additional method to verify identity when accessing college systems, this is known as <u>multifactor authentication (MFA)</u>. MFA adds an extra layer of security to protect you, your personal information and college systems from unauthorized access and phishing attacks.

In order to access any program on the College's network, including MyACC, you are required to:

 Download the free DUO Mobile app on your own mobile device and follow the enrollment steps outlined in the video on the MFA webpage, visit <u>assiniboine.net/mfa</u>. Note: You will only do this when you first attempt to access our college system. Do not delete the app after, you will need it for every time you login to Assiniboine services.

2. Purchase a YubiKey, costs vary by type and are available at the Bookstore. It is important to know the type required for your device.

#### MyACC

**MyACC** allows you to view **MyClass Schedule**, financial account, current and past grades, evaluate your progress in your program, your profile (name, address etc.), **make on-line payments**, set up a payment plan (eligible programs only), change your address, view tax information, request a

transcript, etc. *Note: Class schedules may be modified up to and including the first day of classes, please check your schedule regularly for updates.*

Refer to your schedule on MyACC for the date, time and location of your courses; Assiniboine terms are as follows:

You can access MyACC at <u>myacc.assiniboine.net.</u> It is important that you check it regularly to ensure you are on track to graduate. MyACC Help documents are available in Moodle and the Student Intranet. You must be logged in using MFA to access these resources.

#### College Email

Please note that from this point forward, **Assiniboine will use your unique college email address to contact you,** (<u>yourusername@assiniboine.net</u>). You should also use your official college email for communicating with any college department and it is important that you check your college email regularly.

## 3. UPLOAD A PHOTO FOR YOUR STUDENT ID CARD

Getting your Student ID Card is a two-part process:

- 1. Check that your name, address, and contact information is correct in MyACC. Refer to the registration email you received from the Registrar's Office.
- 2. Go to 'MyPersonalInformation' and log in with your college username and password to upload and submit your photo as soon as you are registered. *Student ID Cards are not available until a photo has been uploaded*.

Your card will be handed out by your School in the first week of classes. Visit <u>Student ID Cards</u> for more information.

## 4. GET YOUR BOOKS & ASSINIBOINE SWAG

Textbook and supply lists are available online 30 calendar days prior to the program start date. View the "Tools & Supplies" tab on your program page <u>www.assiniboine.net/programs/heavy-equipment-operator</u> to obtain your copy.

Textbooks, supplies, Assiniboine clothing and uniforms can be purchased online or at the Campus Store, visit <u>assiniboineshop.ca</u> for more information. The Campus Store is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday to Friday. *Note: it is important that you know your schedule when purchasing your books and supplies as requirements are identified by course, not by program.* 

A variety of other items, including locks, binders, pens, paper, etc. can also be purchased.

#### 5. APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES

All domestic applicants/students should consider applying for scholarships and bursaries. Over \$600,000 is available to Assiniboine students every year. Deadlines may vary, but many have deadlines of July 15<sup>th</sup> or October 15<sup>th</sup>. Visit <u>assiniboine.net/awards</u> and use our **Awards Search Tool** to find and apply for awards. Please note that there is a very limited number of scholarships and bursaries available for international applicants/students at this time.

#### 6. APPLY FOR FINANCIAL SUPPORTS

Did you know most domestic students qualify for financial assistance? Our Associate Registrar, Financial Aid and Awards, and Enrolment Services, helps students identify and apply for financial supports, including government student loans, grants and funding to help pay for their education. ## 7. APPLY FOR TRANSFER CREDIT

If you have taken courses at other accredited educational institutes that are the same, or very similar to courses offered at Assiniboine, you can apply for a transfer of credit. If you think this may apply to you, please read policy <u>A07 Credit for Previous Education</u> and submit the form attached to the policy, along with the course outlines from your prior institution, as early as possible to the **Registrar's Office**. You may also email the completed form and outlines to <u>transfercredit@assiniboine.net</u>.

## 8. APPLY FOR PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT RECOGNITION

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) provides the opportunity to obtain credit for college level knowledge and skills gained outside of the classroom. If you have acquired learning from formal education, work, and/or volunteer experience, personal study and other life activities you may consider applying for PLAR. To learn more, please read policy <u>A06 Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition</u>. Courses available for PLAR are identified with the symbol P in the current <u>academic calendar</u>.

## 9. PURCHASE PARKING OR GET A BUS PASS

Student parking is available at each campus. Please refer to <u>www.assiniboine.net/parking</u> for the list of options and/or pricing for your campus location.

Students studying at campuses in Brandon are eligible for the U-Pass program, which is a Brandon Transit pass sponsored by the ACC Students' Association. Students require their current Student ID Card to receive a U-Pass card. Students must upload their photo prior to arriving on campus to have their Student ID Card available at their orientation or on the first day of class. ## 10. REGISTER FOR THE FREE GET READY FOR COLLEGE ONLINE INFORMATION SESSION

## 11. GET CAUGHT UP ON THE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT YOUR PROGRAM

The trade requires tradespeople to work in many different types of weather conditions. Although the college experience will take place largely in classrooms and shops, it may also take place in the college compound where the construction of buildings may take place or work on outside structures. Students should be prepared to equip themselves accordingly to accommodate these conditions.

## **Required Supplies**

- Safety Boots (CSA Approved, Steel Toe, Green Triangle, minimum 8" high)
- Hard hat (CSA Approved)
- Safety Shirt, Poly (2)
- Safety Glasses (must be clear with Safety Cords) (CSA Approved)
- Leather Work Gloves
- Hearing protection (CSA approved)
- High Visibility Vest
- Coveralls
- Classroom supplies (binders, paper, pens, pencils)
- <u>Must have access to a computer/laptop</u>, complete with a camera, microphone, and Microsoft Office.

- <u>Must have access to the Internet</u>

Welcome to Heavy Equipment Operator!

Heavy equipment operators are well compensated and in-demand both in Manitoba and throughout Canada. From 2017-2026, it is estimated that there will be a requirement to fill roughly 22,000 jobs in this field across Canada.

The six-week in-class program provides students with a combination of training in fundamental heavy equipment operator skills as well as related training in surveying, safety and equipment servicing. Using high-end computer simulation equipment, students gain experience and confidence, before moving to hands-on heavy equipment operating.

Following the in-class program, students complete 120 hours of practicum. Practicum may be paid or unpaid at employer's discretion, students are covered by Worker's Compensation while on practicum. While Assiniboine strives to find practicum placements for students, the responsibility to find a practicum placement ultimately lies with the student.
