Start with an introduction to basic tools and before you know it, you will be reading blueprints, building stairs and framing walls with our nine-month certificate program.

## Why should you choose a career in Carpentry and Woodworking?

- 1 Hammer it home**

Develop the practical skills you need to create excellent work. Learn about hand tools, precise measuring and cutting, and how to create what you envision in your mind's eye. Gain the basic knowledge to build projects from simple shelving to a single family dwelling.
- 2 Understand the craft**

Using modern industry tools, you will learn in a well-equipped woodworking shop with an emphasis on practical, applied learning. Geometry rules in this profession, and general mathematics is very important. Your training will be guided by supportive instructors. Gain experience working with concrete, finishing cabinets and learning construction safety.
- 3 Apply your skills**

Register as an apprentice within two years of completing the program, and you may be granted credit towards Level 1 Carpenter apprenticeship as you continue to gain valuable industry experience.
- 4 Build on your future**

There are a number of career opportunities for graduates. Work in the construction industry on residential or commercial projects. Learn the skills to do general home repairs, as well as your own woodworking projects.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A complete Manitoba Grade 12 or equivalent
- Consumer/Essential Mathematics 40S or equivalent

- Work as part of a team
- Take direction from a supervisor
- Be punctual and attend class on a regular basis

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate with a Carpentry and Woodworking certificate, students must successfully complete 76.5 academic credits and 3 practical credits.

The minimum passing grade for each course is 60% and is indicated on the course outlines. Course failure will result in discontinuance in the program.

## CONNECTIONS

Students who successfully complete the accredited program with an accumulative average of 70% or better in the trade subjects and level for which the program was accredited, gain employment and register as an apprentice within two years of graduating, will receive credit for Level 1 in-school technical training and 900 hours in the Carpenter apprenticeship program.

## PROGRAM FEES

Domestic tuition, fees and Students' Association fees total approximately **\$5,750**.

Estimated cost for books and supplies is **\$2,000**.
