Our programs have lots of learning options to meet your needs. We offer supportive classroom instruction with the ability to choose either day or evening programs. You will have the opportunity to earn dual credits that count for both high school and college credit, provided you attain the required percentage grade.

Your designated student success advisor will help you map your education and career goals. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

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ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- » You must be 19 years of age or over at the time of enrollment or reach the age of 19 before the completion of the course in which you are enrolled.
- » You must be out of high school six months or more.

Each student's academic level is assessed to ensure they get the courses that are right for them.

Those who have already graduated from high school may take up to four additional high school courses tuition-free.

English is the language of instruction at Assiniboine. All applicants educated outside of Canada or in a country not on the test exempt list are expected to meet the English language proficiency requirement. See assiniboine.net/elp for more information.

TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS

Programs at Assiniboine have certain technology requirements. Students require access to computer devices at home and may be required to bring these on campus when instructed. Refer to assiniboine.net/tech for more detailed information about the requirements for this program.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate with a Mature Student High School diploma, students must earn a total of 8 credits, 4 of which must be at the Grade 12 level. Grade 12 English Language Arts and Grade 12 Mathematics are required credits. To graduate with a regular high school diploma, students must complete 30 credits.

The minimum passing grade for each course is indicated on the course outline.

PROGRAM FEES (DOMESTIC ONLY)
