ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Assiniboine Community College is now accepting applications for our **Tuition-Free** Heavy Duty Technician program!

To be considered, you must do the following:

1. ATTEND AN ONLINE PROGRAM INFORMATION SESSION

2. ATTEND AN ONLINE ASSESSMENT SESSION

You must attend an information session before attending an assessment session.

If you decide that you would like to be considered for this pre-apprenticeship program, you will need to attend an online assessment session. You will be assessed on English, Mathematics, Mechanical Aptitude, and general software/document skills.

The assessment session dates are October 14, October 21 and October 28.

Details on the assessment will be provided via email once you have attended an online information session.

3. PROVIDE TRANSCRIPTS & RESUME

After the assessment, selected applicants will be asked to provide the following:

- » Original, official high school and post-secondary transcripts
- » Current resume
