Assiniboine is the only post-secondary institution in Manitoba to offer a Public Safety program administered by the department of education and training and authorized by Manitoba Justice. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates may find employment with municipal, regional, provincial or Indigenous police services in Manitoba, or with other police services across Canada. Note: Police departments have minimum hiring standards regarding sight, hearing and physical ability. Applicants are encouraged to explore these standards prior to entering this program. Other opportunities exist with Canada Border Services Agency, Sheriff's department, corrections, security firms, risk management and loss prevention.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- » A complete Manitoba Grade 12 or equivalent
- » English 40G/40S or equivalent with a minimum mark of 70%
- » Proof of current certification in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) Level C
- » Current criminal record check
- » Current child abuse registry check
- » Current adult abuse registry check
- » Valid driver's license abstract
- » Hearing test
- » Vision test
- » Medical release

Note: Applicants educated outside of Canada may be required to meet additional admission requirements, visit the program page at assiniboine.net/publicsafety.
