The Applied Building Construction certificate program is accredited by Apprenticeship Manitoba. Graduates who meet the requirements and register as an apprentice within two years of finishing the program will receive credit for Level 1 in-school training and 900 hours in the Carpenter apprenticeship program.

Admission Requirements

- » A complete Manitoba Grade 12 or equivalent
- » Consumer/Essential Mathematics 40S or equivalent

Note: While those who meet admission requirements will be accepted into the program on a first-qualified, first-accepted basis, only those who meet Algonquin College's funding requirements will receive funding.

Funding Eligibility Requirements

Funding incentives, made available through partnership with Algonquin College, are available for Indigenous youth 18 to 30 years of age, who are not in employment, education or training (NEET Youth).

ASSINIBOINE COMMUNITY COLLEGE PRE-APPRENTICESHIP ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Assiniboine Community College is now accepting applications for our Applied Building Construction program!

To be considered, you must do the following:

1. ATTEND AN ONLINE PROGRAM INFORMATION SESSION

Choose **one** of the following sessions (you do not need to attend more than one):

» Tuesday, February 28 at 4 p.m.

» Thursday, March 2 at 2 p.m.

2. ATTEND AN ONLINE ASSESSMENT SESSION

You must attend an information session before attending an assessment session.

If you decide that you would like to be considered for this pre-apprenticeship program, you will need to attend an online assessment session. You will be assessed on English, Mathematics, Mechanical Aptitude, and general software/document skills.

The assessment session dates are **March 3** and **March 6**.

Details on the assessment will be provided via email once you have attended an online information session.

3. PROVIDE TRANSCRIPTS & RESUME

After the assessment, selected applicants will be asked to provide the following:

- » Original, official high school and post-secondary transcripts
- » Current resume
