As the Chair, Practical Nursing, Contract Training, you will have an appropriate nursing credential, relevant degree (Masters preferred), be registered and be in good standing with CRNM, CLPNM, or CPNM. You will have experience leading a team in a comparable post-secondary environment or industry. You will have a solid understanding of the CLPNM and the role of the LPN in healthcare, program and curriculum development, Indigenization and decolonization of curriculum, classroom instruction, assessment and evaluation, student advising, and group facilitation. You will have leadership experience in developing faculty and students, along with experience preparing, monitoring, and managing budgets. You will also have relevant experience working with First Nation communities and Indigenous people in program delivery.

This position will entail regular travel to the program sites.
Priority will be awarded to qualified Indigenous candidates.
