Our multiple learning options, including various in-person and online classes, ensure you're able to find the best fit for you, your family and your commitments.

3 LEARN IN A SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

When you contact us to learn more, we set up a conversation between yourself and a student success advisor. This person helps you map out your education and career goals and gets a sense of what type of classes will help you achieve what you want during your time at MSHS. You can even earn dual credits that count for both high school and college credit, provided you achieve the required percentage grade.

4 TAKE THE FIRST STEP

We have four locations to serve you; the Centre for Adult Learning is located in Brandon, Dauphin, Minnedosa, and Neepawa. Classes begin every September and January.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

More opportunities for career advancement are available to people who have received a Grade 12 credential. Obtaining pre-requisites to post-secondary school opens new windows of opportunity for training and employment in new careers.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ You must be 19 years of age or older at the time of enrollment or reach the age of 19 before completion of the course(s) in which you are enrolled.
- ▶ You must be out of high school for at least six months

Each student's academic level is assessed to ensure they get the courses that are right for them.

English is the language of instruction at Assiniboine. All applicants educated outside of Canada or in a country not on the test exempt list are expected to meet the English language proficiency requirement. See assiniboine.net/elp for more information.

INTEGRATED PROGRAM MODEL

The integrated program model is designed to allow students to complete their high school diploma while taking a college level program. Using the dual credit process, some of the courses that students take in the college program also count as high school credits. Students must have completed Grade 12 Math and English before entering an integrated program.

Programs available include Education Assistant and Comprehensive Health Care Aide.

DUAL CREDITS

Dual credits are selected college courses taken at the high school level and count for both college credit and high school completion. These courses can be used for dual credit, provided the student attains the required percentage determined by the college.

PROGRAM FEES (DOMESTIC ONLY)

High school courses are available at minimal cost, allowing students to earn their high school diploma without significant financial barrier. Students pay only the course fees, Students' Association fees and material costs. There is also no application fee for the Mature Student High School diploma.
