Stewart's Principal, the Day Treatment Student, Family, and Community Liaison Worker is an integral member of the JGS Support Team, assisting students both in and out of the classroom by providing behavioural and educational support to ensure academic success and behavioural and social growth. The Day Treatment Student, Family and Community Liaison Workers' role extends student support beyond the school to include family and the community.
