Park Interpreters provide guided experiences to inspire stewardship of our park system's natural features, culture, and history. Programming includes operating the park visitor centre, trail walks and site tours, illustrated talks, roving trailheads and recreation areas, school/youth group programs. Under the direction of the Senior Park Interpreter, the incumbent is responsible for planning and delivering programs in Spruce Woods, and supervises junior staff and volunteers.

An eligibility list may be created for similar positions and will remain in effect for 12 months.

Essential Qualifications:

- Completion of at least one-year post-secondary education in a related field such as biological/natural sciences, natural resources management, education, Indigenous studies, history, recreation/tourism. An equivalent combination of education, training and experience may be considered.
- Strong verbal communication skills including experience speaking to groups.
- Strong interpersonal skills including experience interacting with public.
- Effective written communication skills.
- Ability to work independently under minimal supervision with good time management skills.

Desired Qualifications:

- Experience developing and delivering interpretive programs at a natural, cultural, or historical site, such as a park or museum.
- Knowledge of Manitoba's natural and cultural heritage.
- Knowledge of rules and regulations for visitors in Manitoba provincial parks.
- Bilingual (French and English).
- Supervisory experience.

Conditions of Employment:

- Must be legally entitled to work in Canada.
- Must possess and maintain a valid intermediate or full stage Manitoba Class 5 Driver's License.
- Must be willing and physically able to perform the duties of the position including working in various types of outdoor conditions, hiking trails, and lifting and moving items.
- Must be willing and able to work weekends, evenings, statutory holidays and shift work.

Successful candidates will be required to attend provincial training annually. Work schedule is a five-day workweek that includes Saturdays and Sundays for visitor centre hours and public programming, with regular days off mid-week. Some evening shifts are required.
