This role requires practical experience with water control structures and a strong understanding of heavy civil construction including earth moving. Experience in directing machinery and supervising hired equipment would be an asset. The ideal candidate will also have practical experience in CAD design and GPS surveying in combination with a keen interest in biology.

You need to be an enthusiastic team player – a self-starter who can work with anyone, is capable of seeing the bigger picture and enjoys thinking out of the box. You are an effective communicator who is able to build positive working relationships.
